

The National Assembly for Black Liberation needs a national leadership body, a National Liberation Council, (NLC) to:

1. Develop a 2-year plan to help promote and guide the holding of a national discussion and refinement of the Draft Freedom Manifesto, to create a unity process leading to a 2nd National Assembly in 2020.
2. Help build local and regional Black liberation assemblies as united democratic front committees that intentionally work to unite the battlefronts and political organizations into a conscious national Black liberation movement.
3. Expand the NLC by recruiting other organizations

Meeting schedule - 2 in person meetings annually; and 2 monthly Zoom - face to face conference call a month.

NLC members would distribute Draft Freedom Manifesto to their organizational members and networks, especially among Black activists engaged in mass work.

To submit articles on struggles that impact the Black working-class.

Recognizing that comrades are busy; the Host Committee and the Organizing Committee will together redefine a small group to constitute a secretariat to communicate with and assist NLC members until it is possible to formally establish an organizational center properly funded and staffed.

NLC organizations should have an alternate that is kept abreast of the work and direction and can replace NLC representative in their absence. We want to encourage women's participation and leadership and request that the NLC representative and or alternate be at least one woman.
